6. The **Angus Memorial Trophy** for working Field Hunters
To be ridden as a group following the hounds over fences, with the emphasis on safe distance between horses and good behavior in a group. Appearance to count

 8. The **Simpson Trophy** for pairs under saddle.
 9. The **Cardy Trophy** for teams of 3 in Unicorn formation over a course.
 10. The **McBride Trophy** for Junior Hunters over fences.

To be presented to the junior rider who demonstrates the best horsemanship and deportment throughout the day.

The George Jacobson Trophy

To be presented to the Hunt Club with most accumulated points in all classes.

Class Description (what is being judged)

1. Ross Trophy (Flat class)

Junior Hunter on the Flat

Ridden as a field following the hounds over fences, with the emphasis on safe distance between horses and good behaviour in a group. Appearance to count.

2. Peggy Jacobsen Trophy

Working Field Hunters over fences

Horses are judged on steadiness of rhythm, safety, willingness to jump

3. Hussars Trophy

Pairs over fences

Pairs are judged on synchronicity, fluidity, safety and willingness to jump

4. Kraus Memorial Trophy

For teams of 3 in sequential formation: 3 in lines, unicorn formation, 3 abreast

Teams will be judged on fluidity of formations and appearance

5. St Henry Trophy

For Field Hunter over fences. Members of a recognized pack only.

To be ridden at a good working pace. This class represents a fair degree of difficulty.

Horses and riders will be judged on boldness and steadiness of pace.

6. Peter Schlageter Memorial Trophy (Handy Hunter)

Working Field Hunters over fences

The handy hunter class may ask for the horse and rider pair to trot a log, open and close a gate while mounted, jump several fences, and for the rider to dismount and remount. The horse is judged on its manners, way of going, as well as its suitability as a hunter.

7. Angus Memorial Trophy

Ridden as a field following the hounds over fences, with the emphasis on safe distance between horses and good behaviour in a group. Appearance to count.

8. Simpson Trophy (flat class)

Pairs under saddle

Pairs will be judged on synchronicity, fluidity and appearance

9. Cardy Trophy

Teams of 3 in unicorn formation over each jump

Teams are judged on form, synchronicity and willingness to jump

10. McBride Trophy Junior Hunters over fences.

Horses are judged on steadiness of rhythm, safety, willingness to jump.
